My greatest joy comes when I connect with our Cornerstone International TCKs in person. In September, I had the opportunity to drive to Indiana where I spent several days with a returning missionary family. I spent time debriefing each of the five kids on their experiences living overseas for the past two years. I also spent time with their parents exploring the educational direction and goals they want to pursue while waiting on the Lord for their next assignment. One highlight of the trip was when two other onboarding missionary families living in Ohio came to see us for the day. The kids had so much fun reconnecting with each other and the parents enjoyed the rich time of fellowship and encouragement. I was thrilled to spend time with the three families because it is not very often that we are together in person.

I long to grow in my relationships with the CI TCKs. I have found that Zoom, FaceTime, Signal, and WhatsApp have all provided ways to stay connected on a regular basis with some of the missionary families. I've enjoyed listening to kids share their highs and lows of the past week or month and catching up with their mamas. I've had kids read books to me over Zoom, show me their latest home projects that they are building, help me practice my Spanish, and memorize scripture with me. I am slowly building trust with them. Hopefully, this trust will help us weather the storms of life which are sure to come. It takes time to develop trusting relationships with all of our missionary families. Please pray that God will grant me favor as I look for meaningful ways to connect and support each family in the context of their unique ministry and country.

We had three families join our CI family this year. One family moved to Honduras in August. I've Zoomed or chatted regularly with them as they have settled in to their new life. The move for them has not been easy, but what an honor to walk with them through their transition and experience the faithfulness of God as He has provided for their needs and helped them settle. The other two families are finishing up their support raising and have projected dates for moving to their country of service. I have Zoomed regularly with them and helped their kids process their feelings and concerns about moving to a new country.
