The Best News from Spokane

After receiving a report on January 19th that I likely had a tumor in my left lower lung, I came back in Spokane, Washington to my VA hospital to start the process of dealing with this diagnosis. After my initial appointment with my provider, I flew to Kentucky for the Cornerstone International board meeting to update them for prayer and encouragement before returning to Spokane for whatever treatment laid ahead. When I arrived, I went to the VA urgent care, and my doctor was very thorough in his investigation (Dr. K you rock!). I was admitted for COVID, severe dehydration, anemia, a drug-resistant infection, and a possible blood clot. I spent three days inpatient for tests and treatment. During this time, it was confirmed that I had healthy normal lungs with no masses! Cancer free! I was sent home to isolate for five days.

The day after being released, I was called and informed I was positive for malaria. So, on Good Friday, I went back to the VA hospital to properly treat malaria, severe dehydration and anemia. I was released on Monday. I am feeling better than I have in months! Praise Him!

I am reminded of God's Word in Romans 8:28, "And we know that God causes all things to work together for good to those who Love God, to those that are called according to His purpose".

I am sorry that you all had to go through this journey with me, but I am so thankful for your love and support. Thank God that He used this to find the malaria that we suspect has been in my body since last November. The malaria that was trying to defeat me has been defeated. I continue to love my Lord with all my heart and will follow Him where He leads healthier than I've been in months.

Thank you for your prayers, financial support, and physical support while on this wild journey. I couldn't do this without all of you! I fly back to Uganda on April 18th. I plan to spending these last two weeks visiting a few friends, doing a guided spiritual debrief, and continuing to strengthen so I can follow Him to serve those He puts in WoH's path with vigor and healthy enthusiasm.
