Can you even imagine? I can hear the conversation she and Joseph had on their journey. "You better be praying that there is a comfortable place to lie down when we get there." Caleb and I will continue to have a language tutor to help us grow in Spanish. We have made much progress this past year and can understand a good amount, but speaking is still not as fluent as we would like it. We will also be lesson planning for the new bilingual Christian school and Skilled Trades Program opening up January of 2026, setting up the

workshop and classrooms, assisting with the after-school English program at the Academy, and working alongside Champions in Action every other Saturday at their soccer leagues.

Through all the busyness, we are going to gain a better daily rhythm. We are going to schedule Sabbath rests and we are going to stick with it, no matter what. This year has taught us the importance of Sabbath. We had learned it, studied it, understood it in years past, but we lost it in our priorities and we are excited to bring it back into our routine.
