

Not only did he physically grow, but he became more alert and was attaching as healthy babies do. Returning Henry to social services was one of the hardest things I (Kelita) have ever done. We loved him fiercely and even contemplated what it would look like to keephim long-term. Foster care here is extremely complicated because of the corrupt and broken governmental system. We knew we were in for heartbreak no matter what we chose and that he could be taken from us at any time. We now have a deeper level of understanding of foster care parents. It is our desire to serve those who are caring for abandoned children and to encourage them how we can. Being a part of GiveHope2Kids gives us a unique opportunity to love the children in the ministry but also the heroic parents who care for them daily. Along with this renewed desire to come alongside the fostering parents, we are daily interceding for Henry. We know that his heavenly Father loves him even more than we do. We take praying for him very seriously because it's the only thing we can do for him now that he is not with us. We are also praying that the Lord would bring us other babies needing immediate, short-term respite care.

We hope to continue these classes and grow our friendships along with our ability to rest in Him while creating art.

A church from down the mountain has offered to bring their team up to Urraco every Friday night. It has been such a wonderful blessing and we are praising God for this answered prayer! We are also excited to share that we have found a church in La Ceiba that we have been attending regularly. Our favorite part of this service is that we bring a van load of our friends to worship with us. It's been wonderful to see our children excited to go to church and worship in Spanish!

Beyond art classes and Friday night service, as a family we enjoy helping in other capacities. Ben is always repairing something, repurposing something or having meetings with the parents. We enjoy spending time with the ministry kids or helping Sharon (a missionary who works for GH2K). She has an endless job of sorting donations and making sure each household has what they need for the kids.

We will be in the USA May-July for our first furlough. We will visit family, friends, and supporting churches. We are so excited for this time of connecting and sharing more about GiveHope2Kids. We are excited about the teams coming to partner with us in 2025. If you or your family are interested in coming down, please reach out to us.


In February, we will attend language school in Siguatepeque (which is about a 6-hour drive from our home). We are excited to invest in our family and practice sharing His truths with the people here.
