As this new year continues, God has His perfect (though sometimes challenging) ways of finetuning and refining our faith further in Him. On the website crossway.org, I read this regarding this month's Bible verse (Jeremiah 17:7-8): "Only trust in God motivates confident obedience in times of crisis. [And] a tree planted by water means it is settled with resources no matter what happens. A perfect contrast to the 'shrub in the desert' (Jer. 17:6)." I just love how that explanation is worded. To trust Him, to obey Him, to stand firm in Him, all require a continual choice, a process of repeatedly saying, "Yes, Lord, no matter what happens, my tree and roots are planted in You and You alone."

Sometimes, however, circumstances come up that can really shake our foundation to its core where fear and anxiety come in trying to infiltrate our faith in Him. I recently had a trying time when I was taking care of Noah and Esther Lily alone while Stephen and Ezra were traveling and fundraising for 12 days. My son Noah had been experiencing some issues with his teachers and a classmate and he was having an incredibly difficult time wanting to go to school. During the hardest days I prayed with desperation and would plead for God's help constantly. Through the help of the Holy Spirit, it dawned on me that although I was going to God for help, I was pleading the same thing over and over. My prayers were about getting my trial fixed, and I realized I wasn't allowing myself to stop, slow down, and consciously choose to trust that the Lord would take care of this situation in His perfect ways and timing. Just as Isaiah 48:10-12 (NCV) says, "I have made you pure, but not by fire, as silver is made pure. I have purified you by giving you troubles." It may not be easy, but let us rejoice for we are the few who have chosen the narrow road, and we can be seen like Olympians who are being challenged to get stronger in all areas of our lives. Brothers and sisters, be encouraged to continue to fight the good fight and choose to plant your feet firmly in Jesus daily, especially when the trials come!
